#### Why do I have to pay?

Most associations like to hold conferences/conventions. But, in AA, a conference or convention is an important opportunity to share the AA experience in a broad way. There are many AA conferences held throughout Ohio. One of the most common misconceptions of these gatherings is that they are AA meetings, and since "there are no dues or fees for AA membership..." there should be no fees to attend. Conventions and conferences are special events, not regular meetings. They require months of planning, preparation, and money to present. Since most events are held in hotels/convention centers, there is a charge for the use of the facility. Along with the facility's charge, the hotel/convention center will require that the group purchase coffee and food. Other expenses include travel and lodging for conference speakers (they are never paid a fee for speaking), printing of flyers, schedules, badges, postage and supplies. A large event requires a substantial amount of money to present. The Ohio State Convention of AA is self-supporting. No group monies are used to pay for the event. The cost of the event is paid through registration fees, no baskets are passed. The ideal event is to break even; therefore, the registration fee is nominal compared to a weekend's worth of entertainment anywhere else. Attendance is voluntary and as responsible AA members we pay our own way.

#### **Purpose of the Ohio State Convention**

The Ohio State Convention of Alcoholics Anonymous is an open, annual service convention hosted on a rotating schedule by one of the four Ohio General Service Areas comprised of Area 53 – Central & Southeast OH; Area 54 – Northeast OH; Area 55 – Northwest OH; and Area 56 – Southwest OH.

The purpose of the convention is to carry the spirit of the General Service Conference to individual A.A. members of the districts and groups in Ohio. This is accomplished by fostering cooperation among the four Ohio Areas, highlighting and celebrating the General Service Activities of Alcoholics Anonymous in these areas and through sharing experience on AA's legacies of unity, service and recovery.

The goal of the convention is to support and strengthen the General Service Conference structure in Ohio, helping us to stay sober to help other alcoholics achieve sobriety.

#### The first Ohio State Conference was held in Columbus in July, 1957.

Pete W, delegate for Southern Ohio, wrote in the December 1957 issue of our A.A. Grapevine:

How could it be arranged so everyone could get the picture? That problem really was foremost in my mind. Among these swell people I'd met [at the General Service Conference] were two other delegates from Ohio (Howard B and Edward E). They too were concerned about getting this wonderful experience across to their groups. We...talked to other delegates – who told us about their State Conferences.

This we thought would be the ideal way to get the message across, but it would cost money, and that we didn't have – but we had faith, we had a vision of what this would mean to AA's of our state, and we had friends who had had confidence enough in us to select us as their delegates. We knew if we thought this good for AA they would give us some financial backing.

Plans were started on Sunday, the last Conference day. Since Columbus was located in the center of the state we decided on that as a site for our State Conference, as a beginning. We also asked two of the General Service staff members if they would be available to meet with us.

We came home from the General Service Conference very enthusiastic because we felt we would now be able to render a service that was much needed in our state.

We all started to work making reports, meeting the groups and talking to people about the State Conference. In May, we met with group representatives, committeemen and a newly-elected delegate from the Cincinnati-Dayton area (Ladd S.) and final plans were laid to hold our "First Ohio Conference of A.A." at Columbus in July [1957].
