Treasurer's Report

Hello, Area 54. My name is Candy L., and I am a recovered alcoholic. As a result, I

have been blessed with the opportunity to serve as your Treasurer on Panel 75. This position is of significant importance to our Area, and I will not take it lightly. Yet this service is a small way of giving back to Alcoholic Anonymous for its part in the restoration and transformation of my life. Without God, the fellowship, and the Twelve Steps, I would never be fit for such a blessing. For that, I am forever grateful.

It is important that as members you know the basic responsibilities of the Treasurer. The full description and responsibilities can be found on our website, Area54.org. My basic task is to function as the fiscal officer, the person who oversees the financial duties of the Area. These duties include: maintaining income and expenses records, accepting contributions, paying expenses, and creating and presenting reports to the Assembly and others. An unwritten yet important task is to support the other committee officers and committee chairs as they work to fulfill their service commitments.

Now, a little about the process of following the Tradition of being *self-supporting*, This means that as a fellowship, we are designed to be financially responsible through our own voluntary contributions from the members, and from the sale of approved literature. This is to prevent the group, the districts, the areas, and GSO from depending on outside funding or endorsement which could ruin our autonomy and cloud our primary purpose.

It is important for us all to share in the financial commitment necessary to keep our groups and the wider fellowship of AA *self-supporting*. As we assess the financial standing of our groups, we must keep in mind the whole of Alcoholics Anonymous, not just our specific group. It is recommended that the following contribution guidelines be followed: 50% to our central offices/intergroups, 30% to the General Service Office, 10% to our Area, and 10% to our group's District. These portions can be sent monthly, quarterly, weekly, or yearly, whatever is best for the group.

As the Area 54 financial unit, the Treasurer, Finance Chair, and Finance Committee wants to thrive and grow into our best. We are looking at ways to increase contributions, particularly those not already contributing, without burdening members. There will be more to share as we move forward.

Editor's Note: The Delegate's report refers to the Conference Report that is listed on the following pages of the Recorder. As a past delegate I agreed at the Mini Conference to inform the Area 54 members of the actions in New York in 2025. The following pages seem to be most concise and easiest way to inform. Space for Trustees and International Conference/Regional Forums was limited.

LOVE & SERVICE: I am DeVona and I am an alcoholic, I'm your Area 54 Panel 75 Chair. It's an honor to stand before you tonight to reflect on two cornerstones of our program, two words that resonate deeply within the heart of Alcoholics Anonymous: **Love and Service** These aren't just abstract concepts; they are the lifeblood that flows through our rooms, the principles that bind us together, and the very foundation upon which lasting sobriety is built. Think about it. What brought many of us here in the first place? Was it fear? Desperation? Perhaps. But what *keeps* us here? What compels us to return, meeting after meeting, year after year? I believe it's the **love** we find within these walls. A love that transcends judgement, a love that embraces us in our brokenness, a love that says, "You are not alone. We understand." This love is expressed in a thousand different ways: the understanding nods, the shared experiences, the guiet empathy, and the outstretched hand offering support in times of need. It's in the phone calls at 3 AM, the rides to meetings, and the unwavering belief in our capacity to recover, even when we doubt it ourselves. But love, in its truest form, isn't passive. It's active. It **DOES**. And that's where **SERVICE** comes in. Service is love in action. It's the practical application of our principles, the tangible expression of our gratitude for the gift of sobriety. Service takes many forms in AA. It's brewing the coffee, setting up the chairs, answering the phone, sponsoring a newcomer, sharing our story, or simply listening with an open heart. It's taking on commitments, big or small, to ensure that the fellowship thrives. Service is not about obligation, it's about opportunity. It's an opportunity to step outside of ourselves, to shift our focus from our own struggles to the needs of others. It's in giving we receive, and in serving that we find true meaning and purpose. Because ultimately, love and service are intertwined. They are two sides of the same coin, inseparable and essential. They are the pillars that support our individual recoveries and the strength of our collective fellowship. As we continue our journey together, let us remember the power of these two simple words. Let us embrace love in our interactions and service in our actions. For in doing so, we not only strengthen our own sobriety
